

Dr. Michael Noujaim was born in western Massachusetts but grew up in Beirut, Lebanon. He moved back to Massachusetts in 2004 and attended the University of Massachusetts Amherst, where he studied biochemistry and molecular biology graduating in 2008 with a Bachelor of Science *Summa Cum Laude*. Following his undergraduate studies, he spent a year at UMass Medical School studying the insulin resistance pathway.
